The Senior French 10G, 20G, 30S, and 40S programs have a lot of common components which vary in degree from Grade 9 - 12. All four courses aim at providing the students with a high degree of fluency in speaking, reading and writing to enable them to express themselves intelligently. Listening comprehension is enhanced by exposure to tapes and videos. Oral participation is stressed throughout the French program.

## French 10G

**1 credit**

This course emphasizes the communicative approach in language learning. The skills of listening, speaking, reading and increasingly writing are practiced in a realistic, practical situation.

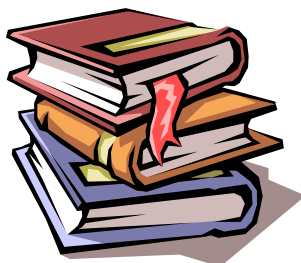
## French 20G

**1 credit**

This course emphasizes the four basic skills: listening, speaking, reading and writing. It is intended to develop new structures and vocabulary to expose students to a variety of supplementary reading material and to make use of the French language for communication.

Topics covered in this course are:

- oral discussions on reading material
- oral and written drills on grammatical structures
- listening comprehension on tapes
- writing of sentences, paragraphs, and oral presentations

## French 30S

**1 credit**

This course continues to emphasize the four basic skills: listening, speaking, reading and writing. It is intended to develop new structures and vocabulary, introduce students to more French Canadian authors, and make use of the French language for communication. It is also designed to encourage students to do extensive reading.

Topics covered in this course are:

- oral discussions on readings
- oral and written drills on grammar
- listening comprehension on tapes
- writing essays, paragraphs and oral presentations

## French 40S

**1 credit**

This course is designed to enhance oral fluency in class discussions, as well as reading skills and vocabulary by reading more complex materials (French authors). Writing skills are enhanced by writing compositions, articles, resumes and short essays. This course encourages students to do extensive reading.

Topics covered in this course are:

- oral and written discussions on reading material
- extensive listening comprehension – on tapes
- oral presentations of written paragraphs and essays
